This bilingual Inari Saami/English book is for older children and adults interested in Saami culture. The book tells the story of a young Inari Saami boy whose adventures sometimes have surprising outcomes. Sammeli discovers a magic drum in a damp shed, that his parents have told him to stay away from, he develops a cold and is consigned to bed. He thinks this puts an end to his adventures. In a dream, when he unexpectedly meets an eccentric squirrel, who has lost his winter supplies, he realises that a new set of adventures has only just begun.
